Building-Wide Installations Insure New Headquarters is a Hit with Employees

CHALLENGE

Nationwide Insurance had decided to consolidate two smaller Ohio offices (in Westerville and Dublin) into one brand new building on a 500,000 square foot campus in the Grandview Yard area of Columbus. Initially, the company was only interested in acquiring storage assistance for its new IT area. Strong relationships with both the architects and the furniture dealers – along with some creative thinking – opened the door to expanded opportunities.

SOLUTION
