

It's More Than Just a Locker

Providing smart laminate lockers as a free amenity or rental to store belongings or pick-up for the exchange of goods gives students, faculty, and visitors the option to use lockers across campus whenever they need one. With a few taps of the phone or presenting the university ID anyone with permissions can access lockers — and without needing to supply their own locks, fill out a paper sign-up sheet, drop off a payment, or stand in a line.

Athletic Facilities

The locker room is the hub of activity. The place where athletes spend their prep time, downtime, and everything in between the final event. Libraries

Offer alumni and booster clubs a place to store belongings on game days. Or for recruits and parents taking the campus tour that don't necessarily care to lug around all of their belongings across campus.

Really, how often do those open cubbies located at your fitness center get used? Or how many padlocks get cut off at the end of the semester? Students can rent a locker at your fitness center however you let them. Daily, monthly, semester-based, or the entire school year.

Performing Arts

Provide your guests a self-sufficient and convenient coat-check or bag-check with rental lockers. When purchasing tickets online or at the time of the show, your guests can rent a locker to store their belongings while enjoying the show.



Smart Locker Management

TAKE A HANDS-ON OR HANDS-OFF APPROACH

Payment & Duration: Administratively, adjust the rates and how different members, such as students, faculty or even visitors, use the lockers. Even adjust for how long members can use a locker for. Daily, weekly, semester, event-based, you name it.

Access: Decide how you want members accessing the lockers. University IDs, 4-digit PIN, mobile credentials, phone app, web app.

Reporting & Usage: Not sure if you have enough lockers? Or charging enough or too much for rental? The built-in reporting capabilities allow for the ability to run aggregate reports and make strategic decisions regarding the smart lockers.




In addition to having lockers that store personal belongings — Exchange of Goods Lockers can provide an added convenience of being able to exchange whatever goods are needed. Utilizing lockers to be able to pick up necessary items without needing in-person coordination can create a productive and streamlined experience.

Exchange of Goods Lockers

Libraries

Create an efficient and streamlined solution for books and tech equipment rentals or repairs with contactless exchange of goods lockers. By strategically placing lockers in common areas, students can retrieve items when convenient for them.



HOW IT WORKS:

A student or faculty member checks out what they want to borrow through a library's online portal. A librarian gets the "order," locates the items, creates a "package" in the software for the recipient, and deposits the item(s) in a locker.

Students or faculty members are notified via email or text when the materials are ready for pick-up. By presenting their credentials — student ID card, phone or watch — to the reader, the locker pops open. They take out their items, shut the door, and the transaction is complete.





HOW IT WORKS:

A student places a food order and they can choose delivery to a smart locker at a convenient location. The provider receives the order, prepares the food, and automatically notifies the student when the meal has been prepared and delivered in the locker. The student completely skips the line and is able to retrieve their food when it is convenient for them.

Many universities have started to partner with food trucks and food ordering sites in addition to the usual campus cafeteria — offering students a variety of food options that can be paid for using their student accounts — and delivered contactless to smart lockers.




Ways to Access a Locker

University ID

Once the locker is rented or booked a student or faculty member can open their locker door a couple of different ways, most common being the university ID. By presenting their ID card to the reader on the locker bank the locker door will automatically pop open for them to put their personal belongings in or pick up their items.

Mobile Credential


Evolving to a connected campus model means mobile credentials — to add student ID cards to Apple Wallet on iPhone and Apple Watch — will become more commonplace before we know it. Rather than holding the university ID to a reader — hold your iPhone or Apple Watch and the door will pop open creating an even more streamlined experience.



The Metra with Genuine HID Technology™ includes Apple's Enhanced Contactless Polling (ECP) application to support credentials in Apple Wallet.

Smartphone Access

Depending on the universities model for how students, faculty and/or visitors will use lockers across campus, lockers can practically pay for themselves. The smart locker software provides you total control to decide how you would like to charge for locker usage. Set the price for the lockers or offer credits to use from student accounts. However you decide on the financial model, the added convenience of locker storage will have your students and faculty wondering what they did without them.



Additional Options

4-DIGIT PIN

Athletes may have no choice to have their phone with them or a university ID — a 4-digit PIN is an alternative solution when phones, IDs or wearables are locked away in the locker.

QR CODE

QR codes are especially convenient when offering lockers to visitors or alumni. While standing in front of the locker, scanning the QR code is an easy option with no additional administration to rent or book a locker.

BIOMETRICS

Uses body's own biometric data, including face, iris and fingerprint to open system auto-assigned lockers or administratively pre-assigned lockers.

Configure and design your lockers as you see fit. Whether you want another way to promote your school colors, logo or mascot, or something more subtle to fit into the design of the building — we've got you covered. Materials



